CONSIDERATION OF APPOINTMENT TO ATHENS CITY COUNCIL TO FILL VACANCY

Mayor Burris noted the City Charter states that when any vacancy shall occur on the City Council, such vacancy shall be filled by the Councilmen. He noted that four names were submitted for the seat - their names were Lisa Dotson, Eddie Arnwine, Amy Goodin, and Eric Morrow. At last week's Study Session, Eddie Arnwine withdrew his name from consideration and Council Member Pelley withdrew Eric Morrow's name.

A motion was made by Council Member Pelley, seconded by Vice Mayor Perkinson, to select Lisa Dotson as the new council appointment to the Athens City Council. Council Member Lockmiller stated they had requests from citizens to nominate a female of color to fill the vacancy. He wanted to go on record that he did not think that those two things were the only things that made a good candidate. He said he was voting yes for Lisa Dotson not because she was a female and not because of her race. He was voting for her because she was qualified to hold the position.
