The caption of Resolution No. 2019-30 was read by the recording clerk. Mayor Burris asked City Manager Sumner to read Resolution No. 2019-30 in its entirety. **Motion was made by Council Member Coker, seconded by Council Member Pelley, to approve Resolution No. 2019-30. Council Member Pelley moved to amend the motion to change the last sentence of the sixth paragraph of the proposed resolution to delete the words "is economically feasible" following the words "be delayed until construction" and add "of Phase I is completed", seconded by Council Member Lockmiller.** Council Member Pelley stated his reasoning for requesting the amendment was because this Council wants the project to be done but they do not know what a future Council will do. Many of the current Council members may not be on the Council in 2026 and what he wants to do is state that when Phase I is done, they move on to the next phase. December 17, 2019 Page 3 of 4

Without the change in wording, a future Council could very effectively decide it was not economically feasible to proceed with the next phase. A discussion followed on the merits of the amendment. Vice Mayor Perkinson asked City Manager Sumner for his thoughts on this issue. City Manager Sumner stated that he did not believe that the amendment as stated would add value and may actually hinder the process because it would lock their hands and they would have to wait, which is most likely the scenario, to complete Phase I before Phase II could move forward. The way the resolution is worded now, their hands would not be tied and they could move forward as fast as is feasible. Upon roll call, the amendment to the motion failed by the following vote:
